### What are Eagle Bucks?

An Eagle Buck is an incentive for students to follow the School Rules (Behavioral Expectations). The purpose of the Eagle Bucks is to promote positive interaction with students by every staff member.

### How do students earn Eagle Bucks?

Staff members should give out a number of Eagle Bucks throughout the school day to the students who are following the School Rules and demonstrating P.R.I.D.E.

## What do students do with Eagle Bucks?

Students should bring their Eagle Bucks to the school store in the cafeteria to purchase items. They can also use them for team activities or other school wide events.
