Dear Parents/Guardians:

We know that many students and their families depend on the Internet, whether at school, or at home, so they can do homework, search for jobs, access financial or government services and much more. The Bright Minds Foundation is teaming with Comcast to make affordable Internet service available to students and their families through a low cost home Internet service called Internet Essentials.

Features of Internet Essentials include:

- \$9.95 per month + applicable taxes with no term contract or credit checks.
- No activation or equipment fees.
- Wi-Fi router included.
- Access to an affordable desktop or laptop computer for just \$149.99.
- Free in-person and online web classes.

Now for the really good news: It's even easier and faster for your family to connect to Internet Essentials because your child's school has been pre-approved for a streamlined enrollment process. Any family with a child attending a school with 40% or more of students enrolled in FARMS is automatically pre-approved for Internet Essentials*. Families can call **1-888-972-5982** or apply online at *InternetEssentials.com*. You'll need to provide your contact information and school name. That's it. No other paperwork is necessary, and if you meet the program's eligibility, you will be pre-approved and could have home Internet within five (5) days.

We want all of our students to have the opportunity to do their homework at home, and we are excited to share information with you about programs like Internet Essentials from Comcast that may be helpful to your family.



To qualify for Internet Essentials, your household must be located where Comcast offers Internet service, have not subscribed to Comcast Internet service within the past 90 days and does not have an overdue Comcast bill or unreturned equipment in the past year. Pre-approval for the program is limited to families of students whose schools have 40% or higher number of students who are eligible to participate in the National School Lunch Program. Internet Essentials from Comcast is a program to provide home Internet service for families. It is not a school or foundation program and is not required by your school. Your school is not responsible for Internet Essentials accounts. No school funds were used for this notice.

ATTENTION PARENTS

VACCINES NEEDED FOR STUDENTS ENTERING 7[™] GRADE!

ALSO students in 8°, 9° and 10° grades that have not had these vaccines are required to get them before the first day of the 2017-2018 School Year.

- MC4V (Meningococcal {meningitis}) vaccine.
- Tdap vaccine (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis, {Whooping Cough})
 We also have Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccine available. This vaccine is optional.

These vaccines are needed in addition to current school vaccination requirements. Please check with your doctor to see if your child has already received these vaccinations. Please bring a copy of their record to school.

If your child needs these vaccines they can get them from his or her doctor or you may come to these FREE IMMUNIZATION CLINICS (insured or uninsured children)

MEDICATIONS FOR NEXT YEAR

If your child will take medication during the coming school year, your doctor or nurse practitioner must complete a medication form. Please be sure that all portions of the form are completed in full. Orders for each new school year must be dated on or after July 1. All medications must be in containers properly labeled with the following information:

- Student name.
- Medication name.
- Dosage to be given.
- Time and frequency of medication.
- Date of medication order.
- Prescriber's name.
- Expiration date.

Pharmacy bottles will usually contain all of the information you need. Over-the-county medications such as cold, allergy and pain relievers should be labeled with the student's name in black marker and brought to the health room in new, unopened containers. Medications should be delivered by a parent/guardian to assure safe arrival. Students should not transport medications.
