




Environmental Program

Free Time Activities




- Socialize in the lodge

North Bay Cabins

- Each cabin holds 10-11 students and 2 parents
- Cabins have full bathrooms
- Air conditioned/heated
- Linens provided
- NO Food or drink (besides water) in cabins
- Assigned by teachers ... some friends and some "new friends"

Phones



- Locked in safe, in cabin, during the day
- Can call parents after evening activities, but then locked again after "lights out"
- No pictures/no video (LEMS staff & North Bay will do this)
- NorthBay does not have public wifi
- No other electronics
- Any "misuse" and phones will be taken and given back at school on Wednesday

Sunglasses

Shoe bag / drawstring bag

What NOT to Bring

- Matches, cigarettes, drugs, or alcohol
