Family File/Emergency Procedure Card Updates

We are making progress but only have 52% of our Student Emergency Contact Information Complete. If you have a conversation with your neighbor who has a HCPSS student please remind them to update their Family File account.

We are asking ALL families to log into HCPSS Connect to check that all of your information is correct – Contact Information, Emergency Information, etc. The biggest reason for this request is that Lake Elkhorn Middle School and HCPSS will use **ONLY** the information located here to send announcements, notices, mail, contact parents/guardians in case of an emergency, etc. If the information is not correct, all of the before mentioned items will go unreceived/unnoticed.

Please make sure to enter current phone numbers and an e-mail that is checked frequently.

HCPSS Connect provides access to a variety of student information and classroom instructional tools offering personalized communication and timely, relevant and easily accessible information relating to your student. Families that update and complete their Family File will be able to view teacher placements last Thursday, August 30th.

HCPSS uses Family File for parents/guardians to complete emergency information. Parents/guardians must verify and/or update information for each child, and can do so by logging in HCPSS Connect and selecting the Family File tab and then clicking on Family File.
